
MESSAGE FROM THE PREZ

My experience as a 1st time club team member - Felix

I did not take my role as a team member lightly and did as much work as I could to prepare for this tournament well in advance of hitting the water. No amount of research got me prepared for the realities of fishing in 3-5mph current, wind and water so clear at 30 feet that I felt I could drink it. Just AMAZING!

My practice day with Paul on Friday did a ton to help build my confidence. We ended up on some decent fish and I recognized quickly that placing orders for heavier weights was the smart thing to do. If anyone needs 3/4oz tube or drop shot weights I can refer you to a good brand. LOL. We found the river current very strong but still managed to find a good series of spots to use during the tournament.

Tournament weekend I was blessed to be paired up with two great partners who put me on fish over the weekend. Through careful observation and conversation they taught me how to work in

these challenging elements. That deep drift technique for smallmouth landed me all my smallmouth while pitching and flipping a craw landed all my largemouth. My heart stopped each time I was hooked up to one of these 3+lb smallies. I had to fight them through current, wind and boat position. Quite the challenge. Quite the thrill! I have a newfound appreciation for fishing the drop shot and for practicing tying good knots all winter.

Throughout the entire event the team was phenomenal. Helping one another out with tackle, discussing techniques which were working/not working and just simply having a good time in each other's company.

I truly hope I get the opportunity to represent the club again. If not I hope that others consider it. These words don't do justice to the experience.
